About Washington DC

Washington, DC is a city of great contrast. It is both our nation's capitol and a city with great poverty and crime. Its 67 square-mile area contains rich and poor, black and white, young and old, native and alien, homeless and landed-gentry, the powerful and powerless, lawmakers and lawbreakers. Impoverished public housing projects are within blocks of lush neighborhoods where nations of the world house their embassies and consulates.

Washington, DC has struggled with the issue of homelessness since the 1880's. Between 1860 and 1880, D.C.'s population soared from 40,000 to 120,000. Completely overwhelming the city's infrastructure, these new arrivals, mostly freed slaves from the former Confederacy, subsisted in severely overcrowded, disease-ridden, and impoverished conditions. D.C.'s first building and health codes were written in 1880 to cope with this crisis.

Because D.C. is a federal district and not a state, it has no voting representation in Congress.

In recent years, D.C. has gone through significant change due to gentrification. It is one of the most gentrified cities in the US with over 40% of The District's neighborhoods experiencing it since 2000, making it consistently one of the most expensive cities to live in the United States in recent years. During this transition, neighborhoods that have been affected by gentrification have seen their low-income populations decrease by almost 30%. In these same areas the black population has decreased by 23% while the white population increased by 202%.

At CSM DC you get to learn about our country's rich history and also serve those in need. One morning you might be getting up early to prepare and serve breakfast for those needing a meal. In the afternoon, you might be working along side of church leader running a VBS. Our ultimate goal is be the hands and feet of Christ.

Trip Logistic Information

Housing:

Groups are housed at Douglas Memorial UMC, an inner-city congregation in Northeast Washington D.C. The church has many great ministry programs that help the community, such as food and clothing distribution ministries, prayer, worship, and Bible study activities. We will also be using an additional housing site for many summer months when we have large group sizes.

The girls are all in one room and the guys are all in another. We have about 15 sets

of bunkbeds in each room! There's one bathroom for guys with a toilet a urinal and a shower. And one bathroom for girls with 2 toilets and a shower. Unfortunately this means that showers are every other day. The fellowship hall on the first floor is where we eat breakfast and make lunch and hang out, and the sanctuary on the second floor is where we do devotions and worship night.

There is air conditioning!

Health and Safety:

CSM will operate with your safety as a high priority but this will require the cooperation of your group. Our housing site and the service sites that we work with are highly respected safe havens in their communities.

Following evening activities, groups will remain inside the housing site and the door will be locked.

All CSM staff are certified in First Aid and CPR and are equipped with First Aid kits. Please advise CSM staff of any allergies/medical conditions of your group members prior to arrival and report all injuries (minor and major) to your CSM host (if injury occurred while with CSM).

Bedding (sheets or sleeping bag, blanket, pillow)
Personal toiletries (towels, soap, shampoo)
Bible, Pen, Journal
Work clothes – modest things that can get dirty and are comfortable to work in.
Long pants are required at many sites (leggings = not pants). Please pack at least one pair of

We also recommend one long sleeved shirt for sites where you are doing yard work
(protects against poison ivy & mosquitoes).
